HANDS TOGETHER MINISTRY IN HAITI

Next weekend, we welcome Ms. Judy Skitek representing *Hands Together* ministry in Haiti, as part of the Archdiocesan Mission Cooperative Plan. Her presence reminds us that our church is fundamentally a Mission Church. She will speak at all the Masses.

The Church in Haiti is struggling to

bring God's love to many hurting people. In Haiti there are 10.9 million people, in an area smaller than Maryland. 70% of these people cannot read and 85% live below the poverty level. In slum areas, 4 out of 5 children do not reach the age of five; and nationally 1 in 3 children suffer from chronic malnutrition. The hurricanes in 2004 and 2008, along with the devastating 2010 parthypulse and hyrricane left Haiti

ing 2010 earthquake and hurricane, left Haiti severely damaged and in desperate need of our prayers and support.

Hands Together runs free schools, medical clinics, and nutrition programs in Cite Soleil; providing 25,000 daily school meals and helping thousands of people who struggle just to survive. Their work among the violence and savage poverty is founded upon the Catholic Church's social teachings of the dignity of human life and a preferential option for the poor.

Judy is a faithful volunteer for *Hands Together*, who has been to Haiti many times and visits parishes around the U.S. to share her experience.

This Sunday, November 4th, the Young Adult Ministry will host a panel featuring LGBTQ members of the Paulist Center community, who will discuss why they still come back to the Catholic Church despite the adversity and struggles of reconciling one's faith and identity.
