Jane has modeled how to create social justice within her own home and family by opening her home and her heart to her foster children for years - a social justice of the home and family. By her example, we can see that the fight for justice can happen inside AND outside of one's particular professional vocation, and can be expressed in how we live rather than what we do to live. 

DIRECTOR'S REFLECTION

Dear Companions on the Journey,

PARADOXICALLY, Love is one of the hardest things to preach about. Last week, I preached on the "Two Great Commandments": Loving God and loving neighbor.

One parsing of love says that there are four types of love. These were originally defined by the ancient Greeks and still expressed in their language:

"Eros" is romantic love, sexual attraction. Although not usually associated with the first commandment, some of the great mystics of the Church (e.g., Hildegard of Bingen, Julian of Norwich, John of the Cross) have felt this kind of love for our gracious God.

"Storge" is the second kind of love which might be best understood as affection. It is the love that is directed towards family, friends, objects and places. One might call it natural or instinctual affection.

"Agape" is self-emptying love whereby one gives oneself for another, as Jesus did for us on the cross. But agape can also mean simply selfless service to the other without any intention of reward or return.

"*Philia*" denotes the special expression of love found in friendship. Desire (as in *Eros*) is not part of the relationship but simply the good of the other.

Time for a quiz (true story): "Jim 'Mattress Mack' McIngvale took the initiative the moment Hurricane Harvey struck. He opened up his furniture stores to victims of the disaster. He sent this delivery trucks to rescue people, even telling them to bring their pets. Think of it as a 'slumber party on steroids,' McIngvale quipped. 'I was raised as a Catholic...I continued my Catholic faith throughout my life, trying to do the right thing and hopefully you do the right thing and help people along the way."

What kind of love is that? Not so important as the right category is the right action. For the Jews of the Hebrew Scriptures, love was less sentiment and more of action. Jesus, the good Jew, said the second greatest commandment (like the first) is to love one's neighbor as one loves oneself. How do you love?

What do you think?

And let us pray for/with one another.
