# DEAR PAULIST CENTER PARENTS,

From the earliest days of the sexual abuse crisis, we have understood the paramount importance of assuring the protection of children and ensuring that the sexual abuse crisis is never repeated. We must be ever vigilant for the protection of children in order to keep safe our most vulnerable and to restore the confidence of the faithful in the Church. While progress has been made on many fronts, we continue to work diligently to ensure that our protection and prevention efforts are strengthened and that the healing process is fostered.

Toward that end, one of the pillars of prevention is a standard personal safety curriculum for our children. This educates children about appropriate and inappropriate contact with adults, and helps them to develop the skills to communicate with parents and caretakers. On Sunday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, grades 1-4 participated in the session, *Talk About Touching*. On the 14<sup>th</sup>, grades 5-8 attended, *Keeping Children Safe*.

We also recognize that family involvement is critical in teaching children personal safety skills, especially those that will help prevent child sexual abuse. The video, *What Do I Say Now? How to Help Protect Your Child from Sexual Abuse*, was developed to provide parents and caregivers 1) information about sexual abuse; 2) guidelines for providing a safe and caring environment for young children; 3) practical examples of how and when to talk to children about safety and touching; and 4) guidelines for responding to a child who has disclosed abuse.

What Do I Say Now? offers a variety of ways to teach touching rules. Parents or caregivers must decide how they will present the information themselves based on their child's age and developmental level and their own family values. The video offers ideas for helping children learn how to set boundaries – with both peers and adults – in relation to personal touching.
