

very Advent at the Paulist Center, we host a Jesse Tree in our Lamary Alcove. The Jesse Tree is a way of preparing for the coming of Jesus on Christmas Day. Jesse was the father of King David. The Jesse Tree is named from the Scripture passage from the Book of Isaiah. [Isaiah 11:1-10]

Typically, community members take a symbol or tag off the tree to purchase a gift or gift card for the agencies and/or the individuals and fami-

lies with whom they work: SS Francis & Therese Catholic Worker House, The Agape Community, CrossRoads Family Shelter, and this year, we are adding Afghan refugee families to our list of recipients.

For the sake of Covid safety measures, we are hosting a virtual Jesse Tree again. We still do not want to physically take in and deliver the large amount of gifts we typically do each year. - My thoughts about gift giving have changed. Most of us have too much stuff and not enough time. For people who are lonely I offer conversation and a visit, for people who are too busy I give my time to complete a task.
- I've become pretty devoted to composting in the past couple of years, and now I can't imagine not doing so. The City of Cambridge makes it easy, providing bins and weekly pick-up, and our neighborhood library has free composting bags for patrons. I'm happy to see all the green bins lined up on our street on trash day and have to admit I'd feel guilty now if I weren't joining in. How can I not save food scraps, peels, rinds, coffee filters, egg shells and the like? I'm hopeful that somewhere soil is enriched.

Sponsoring Afghan Refugee Families - Donations Needed!

The Paulist Center and St. Cecilia Catholic parish have together established a POWIR (Parishes Organized to Welcome Immigrants and Refugees) site to sponsor two Afghan families - one with 6 members and another with 8 members.

This responsibility involves many things, but **our biggest challenge is to raise \$15,000 by Wednesday, December 15**th to pay for the initial expenses of housing, food, clothing and other necessities until certain government benefits become available. At this time, we are waiting for the final assignment to come through Catholic Charities, but we are told families could arrive any week now.

Paulist Center and St. Cecilia representatives met for the first time eight weeks ago. Since then we have recruited 40 volunteers to work with the families welcoming them; introducing and orienting them to housing, education, health care, public transportation and more; teaching them English, registering their children in school, providing transportation, and performing many more tasks.

In addition, the Paulist Center/St. Cecilia partnership has reached out to additional faith communities including the Sisters of St. Joseph of Boston; St. Ignatius Catholic Church at Boston College; The Islamic Center of Boston; the Islamic Circle NE; and St. Katharine Drexel Catholic Church in Roxbury; all of whom have agreed to join the effort, although not at the full partnership level.
