HOPE FOR THE FUTURE CAMPAIGN

During this coming quarter of the new year, the Paulist Center is participating in the *Hope for the Future*:

A Comprehensive Campaign for the Paulist Fathers. This landmark campaign is the product of years of planning and hard work by Paulist priests, lay leaders, and Paulist staff.

The focus of the campaign is to build a new Paulist House of Mission & Studies, fortify outreach ministries, support senior Paulists, and attend to deferred capital needs of Paulist houses around the country. The campaign will also **directly benefit the Paulist Center**, as fully **20**% of funds raised by our community will **remain in Boston** as a fund earmarked for capital repairs/upgrades to our building for shared projects that would normally be paid for jointly by both the local Paulist household and the Paulist Center Community (vs projects that only impact either Center space or household space that would normally be paid for by the respective party). Detailed information about these campaign goals will be sent to every community household in the months ahead.

To be clear, this is **different from the Annual Paulist Appeal** (this year on the weekend of January 22nd) which helps keep the lights on and fund the thriving Paulist ministries (but the total of which will count towards our overall Campaign goal). This campaign is a one-time, extraordinary effort to fund the Paulist Fathers for many years to come.



Our community is participating in this campaign primarily in February and March. We need many volunteers to assist the Paulist Center for this campaign to be successful. ONE OF OUR AFGHAN FAMILIES HAS ARRIVED!

The first family arrived on Wednesday, December 29th and was welcomed by a small group of parishioners from the Paulist Center and Saint Cecilia parish POWIR* site. For more information, click here to see the new website of the Paulist Center Immigrant Advocacy Group (IAG).

We are anxiously awaiting news of our second family.

So far, parishioners have given their time, talent and treasure; making donations, gathering goods and furnishings, and signing up to provide direct help to our families. Teams have been formed to support the families with transportation, groceries, and companionship. We are immensely grateful and humbled by the outpouring of support. **Thanks to tremendous generosity from our communities, we have met our initial goal of \$100,000.** This will cover their transition and basic needs, including rent and utilities, culturally appropriate food and clothing, and transportation.

Our **most immediate need is gift cards from grocery stores** (Stop & Shop, Shaw's), clothing stores (Target, Old Navy, Macys, Walmart), Pharmacies (CVS, Walgreens), **and pre-loaded Charlie Cards**.

These can be dropped off at the Paulist Center's front office during the week, 10:30am - 4:30pm, or mailed to: Paulist Center, 5 Park St, Boston, MA 02108 - ATTN: Susan Rutkowski Place mark them with "POWIR" and your name so that we might properly acknowledge your donation.

We will also continue to accept cash donations to cover unforeseen costs for the year and potential support for other refugee families in the future, but at this time gift cards are a lot more useful.

We look forward to learning more about our two families and understanding their specific needs. We will need to help them navigate through complex government programs, ensure their children have a good education, prepare them to find work, learn English, and navigate a new culture.
