They are not trying to twist your arm, they simply would like to briefly explain the campaign goals, answer your questions and invite you to support the campaign.


HIDDEN MERCY BOOK DISCUSSION



This is one journalist's--gay and Catholic himself--compelling picture of those quiet heroes who responded to human suffering when so much of society--and so much of the church--told them to look away. These pure acts of compassion and mercy offer us hope and inspiration as we continue to confront existential questions about what it means to be Americans, Christians, and human beings responding to those most in need.

INTRODUCTION - A CREATION-CARING LENT Fasting From Overconsumption And Living More Simply

Our goal this Lent is to fast from over-consumption and to live more simply. The Paulist Center *Creation Care ministry* invites us all to a **Creation-Caring Lenten practice**, using the traditions of fasting and prayer to focus on our relationship with God's creation.

Today humanity is using God's creation faster and more extensively than ever before. In 1970, humanity's ecological footprint was about equal to the planet's biocapacity (what the earth can regenerate). Today, humanity is consuming more than one and a half times that capacity.

Pope Francis' Letter "Laudato Si": On Care for Our Common Home" exhorts us 'to hear the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.'

This Lent, each week's bulletin will highlight a different opportunity for fasting and for embracing a simpler lifestyle.

The challenge of simplicity is to live counter-culturally, not by popular standards. Lent is an opportunity to adjust our consuming patterns and increase our joy in the gifts of Life.

From Laudato Si':

"Christian spirituality proposes an alternative understanding of the quality of life, and encourages a prophetic and contemplative lifestyle, one capable of deep enjoyment free of the obsession with consumption ... and the capacity to be happy with little."

Action: Remember Lent as a child? The challenge and satisfaction of fasting from something that was important to you? This year, try fasting from over-consumption and living more simply. Each week you'll have the opportunity to experiment with choices that are more sustainable and just.
