## WAYS OF GIVING

Our "Community Gift" is the Paulist Center's tradition of giving away 5% of our weekend offerings, averaged out over the year, to a group outside of ourselves. We are so very grateful for your support during this time of uncertainty and financial challenge.

# **Fasting From Overconsumption** and **Living More Simply**

#### MARCH 20: WEEK THREE - CONSUMPTION

ur Lenten practice this week is to reconsider our relationship to stuff. (source: Lent 4.5, Passionist Earth and Spirit Center, Louisville, KY)

The U.S. comprises 5% of the world's population but consumes 30% of the world's goods. Christian simplicity means cutting back, reducing harm, and making conscious choices in purchasing and disposing of anything.

THINGS TO CONSIDER: Do I need more stuff? Reduce and Re-use. Give things away instead of throwing them in the trash. Go paperless. Join the zero-waste movement. Stop junk mail (at catalogchoice.org). Fast from single-use containers. Fast from shopping-as-entertainment. Bigger picture: support legislation for Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) for post-consumer products and waste.

#### **WORDS TO LIVE BY:**

Laudato Si': "Climate problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture." Luke 12: "Jesus said to them: one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions."

**IF YOU CAN ONLY DO ONE THING,** give up bottled water this Lent, and beyond. Single-use plastics are toxic to the environment; a bottle takes 450 years to decompose.

## MARCH 27: WEEK FOUR - TRANSPORTATION

Our Lenten practice this week is to explore alternate ways of getting around in order to reduce our carbon emissions. (source: Lent 4.5, Passionist Earth and Spirit Center, Louisville, KY)

Transportation and energy use are the biggest contributors to most people's carbon footprint. 1/3 of U.S. air pollution comes from petroleum-powered transportation.

THINGS TO CONSIDER: make fewer car trips; combine / postpone errands; share a ride; go public transport; skip the elevator / take the stairs; explore walking & biking; choose local options. Your next vehicle? Maybe an EV or plug-in hybrid.

#### WORDS TO LIVE BY:

John 14: I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

IF YOU CAN ONLY DO ONE THING, try to abstain from using your car for one whole day, or more.
