
BOOK CLUB - "RACIAL JUSTICE AND THE CATHOLIC CHURCH"



A CREATION-CARING LENT

Fasting From Overconsumption and Living More Simply

APRIL 3: WEEK FIVE - ENERGY

ur Lenten practice this week is to consume energy more efficiently and to use more Clean energy. (source: Lent 4.5, Passionist Earth and Spirit Center, Louisville, KY)

God has truly furnished creation with energy in abundance. But we are not living sustainably in relationship with creation. Poor communities and communities of color disproportionately suffer the unjust consequences of current patterns.

THINGS TO CONSIDER: try fasting from carbon by using less energy. Consider transitioning your home heating from fossil fuels to all electric. Revisit your programmable thermostat. Many towns offer the option of electricity from Green energy sources; the Paulist Center did this several years ago and fellow Paulist Center members have as well. Add insulation; wear sweaters; get a home energy audit; consider solar panels. Bigger picture: support U.S. transition from fossil fuels including divestment from fossil fuels.

WORDS TO LIVE BY: *Laudato Si'* – "The climate problem is aggravated by a model of development based on the intensive use of fossil fuels at the heart of the worldwide energy system. ... Our industrial system, at the end of its cycle of production and consumption, has not developed the capacity to absorb and reuse waste and byproducts."

IF YOU CAN ONLY DO ONE THING, use LED lights; they use 75% less energy and last 25 times longer than incandescent bulbs.

APRIL 10: WEEK SIX - GRATITUDE AND GENEROSITY

ur Lenten practice this week is almsgiving – exploring new ways of opening our hearts. (source: Lent 4.5, Passionist Earth and Spirit Center, Louisville, KY)

We live in the wealthiest nation in history. Jesus had a lot to say about freedom from possessions and taking responsibility for the common good. Generosity comes from a sense of being part of the web of God's creation.

THINGS TO CONSIDER: practice acts of kindness in your neighborhood and with strangers; use your voice on behalf of the poor, the immigrant, the unborn, the Earth; support work toward climate solutions. Bigger picture: urge elected officials to support legislation making justice and creation-care a priority.

WORDS TO LIVE BY: *Laudato Si'* - "Here I want to recognize, encourage and thank all those striving in countless ways to guarantee the protection of the home which we share. Particular appreciation is owed to those who tirelessly seek to resolve the tragic effects of environmental degradation on the lives of the world's poorest."

IF YOU CAN ONLY DO ONE THING, contribute to the microfinance movement (e.g., **kiva.org**); even very small loans offer possibilities for people in developing countries.
