CALL FOR 2022 HECKER AWARD SUBMISSIONS

Since 1974, the Paulist Center Community has presented the Isaac Hecker Award for Social Justice to an outstanding North American Catholic. Recipients of the award have included locally and nationally recognized women and men - lay people, sisters, priests, and bishops. Some have been involved in direct service to those in need, others in advocacy works and the transformation of structures and institutions. Many of the recipients have been committed to both these dimensions of social actions. Isaac Hecker, founder of the Paulist Fathers, was particularly concerned with the growth and development of American Catholicism. Isaac Hecker and the early Paulists devoted themselves to mission preaching, communication of the word of God. Hecker's spirituality involved looking to the heart, listening to the spirit, and living in America. The award was named to honor Isaac Hecker.

LIGHT DAWNS ON A WEARY WORLD

Here at the Paulist Center, one could easily describe the past few months as a time of "returning." In September, our *Family Religious Education Program* returned to in-person classes. In October, the *Wednesday Night Supper Club* started serving meals again in our auditorium. Gradually, we have begun to have more and more in-person meetings and have also held a few Community Coffees while attendance numbers at Mass have increased steadily over the past few months. As we emerge from a time of isolation and separation, our community has begun to re-emerge, to re-engage, and to experience the light of hope and renewal.

On December 10 and 11 our community will come together for another "return" event. The Paulist Center music ministry will present *Light Dawns on a Weary World*, our first Advent-Christmas Concert in three years. We will also have the return of our liturgical dance ministry's pageant "A Christmas Story." This is an opportunity for us to pause, to take a break from the frenetic pace of this time of year, to reconnect, to join in song, and reflect upon the words and images that emerge in this season.

Our program will feature fourteen songs, a combination of familiar hymns and less familiar songs from newer composers from various places around the world. In the first part of the program, we will hear John Michael Trotta's powerful work "Veni, Veni Emmanuel." A piece conceived as a dialogue between supplicants and the creator, a combination of old and new, juxtaposing a personal longing for something still to come, with steadfast assurance of something ever-present.

Later in the program we will raise our voices and sing, "Awake, awake and greet the new morn, for angels herald its dawning. Sing out your joy, for soon he is born, behold! the Child of our longing." A new day breaks. The light and warmth of the sun spreads into our world, into our lives. "In darkest night his coming shall be, when all the world is despairing, as morning light so quiet and free, so warm and gentle and caring." Into our darkest night, we receive the promise of light and peace.

Mary Louise Bringle's advent hymn opens with these words, "Light dawns on a weary world when eyes begin to see all people's dignity. Light dawns on a weary world: the promised day of justice comes."

How can light and peace be promised? We all have experienced its opposite. We know conflict. We have gone to bed longing for a new day to break. If anything, it seems that war and division is certain. So what is this promise? Jesus's first words to his disciples following his resurrection were the promise, "Peace be with you." This was not a promise that they would be free of fear or that they would never again experience discord. It is true, strife is certain. The promise of God's light and peace is stronger. In Christ, death has been defeated. In Christ, love is stronger than hate. We experience peace when we live with the awareness of this power and promise, even in the midst of all that rages around us.

We close this year's program with the familiar and time-honored carol by Dan Kantor, "Night of Silence." "Cold are the people, winter of life, we tremble in shadows this cold winter night. Frozen in the snow lie roses sleeping, flowers that will echo the sunrise...breathless love awaits darkened souls, soon will we know of the morning." May this season of returning – of re-awakening – be a time of grace and renewed hope, drawing us deeper into the story of the One who came to be with us!
