NEW OLD GUY IN TOWN

I feel a bit different from the way I felt about my first coming to 5 Park Street in Boston.

Back in 2010, I was coming from the West Coast and eager to start a new ministry at the Paulist Center.

I was joined by a new director at that time, Fr. Frank Desiderio, and we, the staff inherited a 5-year plan from the previous director, Fr. Paul Huesing. It was then a great way to get to know the operations of the Paulist Center Community (PCC). As Frank, the pastoral staff and I worked with the members of the PCC to look at the next five years, we were made aware of the history of the PCC as well as the hopes shared by all for the future of the community.

Much has changed in our lives as Catholics, Americans, Bostonians since those special first few months.

As for me, I have served in a couple of new ministries beginning in 2014 when I was asked to be the local Superior for the Paulists in Boston. I continued to serve as a pastoral associate with Fr. Mike McGarry. Then in 2017 I convinced then-Speaker of the MA House of Representatives, Robert De Leo, that he needed to fulfill his first constitutional responsibility as penned by John Adams; namely to appoint a House Chaplain! I enjoyed my time on Beacon Hill in that capacity and it gave me the opportunity to learn more about my home state. For those of you who don't know me, I am a rare bird in that I was born on the North Shore (Gloucester) and raised on the South Shore (Weymouth). Ask around, you won't find many of us.


I was then asked by the Paulists to serve as the pastor of the "Original Paulist Parish," St. Paul the Apostle Church at Lincoln Center in New York City. It was an honor to be asked and it was an honor to lead the parish during the trying times of the pandemic. I'll never forget walking down to Times Square on a Saturday in late March and being one of two people in the entire area with all the lights still shining brightly on Broadway!

I was asked by the Paulists to leave NYC and to come home to Boston to assist Fr. Rich Andre as a pastoral associate and to be the local Superior. I come to you with a hope that I can bring with me the experiences I had as the pastor of a complicated parish and share those exploits with others.

I am a hopeful person who enjoys celebrating the faith we have received from our spiritual father St. Paul. There is much to do here in the Hub and it is my sincere hope that I can be a part of something that invigorates our faith lives and brings the hope of Christ to others in and throughout the Archdiocese of Boston.

COMMUNITY GIFT

The Paulist Center gives 5% of our annual offertory to 52 other charitable organizations with missions consonant with our own. These organizations receive an equal amount from our annual offertory, but we highlight one of them each weekend.

The weekend of **July 1 and 2** we raise up **National CARES Mentoring Movement** - their mission is to secure, heal and transform the lives of impoverished Black children by inspiring, recruiting and mobilizing masses of caring Black men and women to mentor and nourish them.

The weekend of **July 8 and 9** we raise up **Angel Flight**. This organization coordinates free air and ground transportation for medical patients whose financial resources would not otherwise enable them to receive treatment or diagnosis, or who live in rural areas without access to commercial airlines.

SYNOD UPDATE

We've updated <u>our webpage on the 2021-2024 Synod on Synodality</u> to include the instrumentum laboris (working document) issued by the Vatican for the month-long meeting in October 2023, the first at which lay women and men will vote alongside bishops. This document is an extraordinary one in the history of the Church — presented not as a draft of what the October 2023 meeting will produce, but as a series of issues, questions, and worksheets, including topics that until recently had never been mentioned in official Vatican documents.

We also recommend a <u>lengthy article by Bishop John Stowe of Lexington</u>, <u>KY</u>, assessing the Synod's reception thus far in the United States.

RACIAL JUSTICE ADVOCACY GROUP (RJAG) JOINS OTHERS FOR HOUSING JUSTICE

The lack of sufficient affordable housing in the state of Massachusetts disproportionately affects people of color. At least 9 members of the Paulist Center were among the 1,400 people gathered by Greater Boston Interfaith Organization at Temple Israel on June 26 to advocate for statewide housing justice reform.

Mayor Wu, Housing Secretary Augustus, and Lt. Governor Driscoll, all in attendance, were both thanked and challenged in their work to improve housing access and quality for groups that have been unfairly denied it and help to close racial and class disparities in the housing market.
