LEN & CHERYLANN GENGEL

TO RECEIVE THE ISAAC HECKER AWARD FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE NEXT SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 18!

en & Cherylann Gengel, founders of the Be Like Brit Foundation, will accept the 2021 Isaac Hecker Award for ✓ Social Justice next Saturday, November 18 at the 5pm Mass. We will livestream the event; here is the link.

Len and Cherylann are parents to Britney Gengel who lost her life tragically in a 7.0 magnitude earthquake during a college service trip in 2010. Britney's last text to her mother included a wish,

"I want to move here and start an orphanage myself."

After Britney's death, the Gengels started a nonprofit, the Be Like Brit Foundation, and opened an orphanage in Grand-Goâve. Britney's parents built this orphanage - Brit's Home - on the island in an effort to give back and serve the children of Haiti, and honor their daughter's memory, compassion and legacy.

The Be Like Brit Foundation was chosen for their commitment to continue the compassion of Britney Gengel by serving the children of Haiti through sustaining a

safe, nurturing home rooted in the virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love, while developing a sense of social responsibility, community involvement, and unconditional love. Their vision is to support them through:

- Brit's Home: an orphanage in which 66 children live, go to school, and have three balanced meals a day.
- Brit's Academy: provides in-house, quality education to all 66 of the children.
- **Sustainability**: Brit's Home uses solar panels for electricity needs.
- **Transition Program**: supports children as they grow and transition into adulthood.
- Health Care: Brit's Home has nurses who provide general medical care for children, staff, and their families.
- Community: Be Like Brit is the largest employer in the area. Through a collaborative approach, the staff and members of the local community develop treatment plans, curriculum, and all policies and processes. In addition, the foundation distributes up to 1,000 gallons of purified water daily to local families in the community.

People in Haiti are still recovering from earthquakes, hurricanes, and disease outbreaks, while poverty, political unrest, and violence continue to leave Haiti in a critical state. We applaud Len and Cherylann for making a profound difference in our world by being tireless advocates for the children and people of Haiti. Their work and leadership are particularly inspiring for all Catholics around the world, especially as a model for how a family can overcome grief to make a significant contribution to helping so many who are less fortunate.



COMING NEXT WEEKEND:

Annual Financial Report & Impact Statement for Fiscal Year 2023

(September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023)

Next weekend, we'll give a brief report on our revenues and expenses in FY 2023. We had predicted a substantial deficit in each of our last five fiscal years, but in each FY between 2019 and 2022, something unexpected happened that balanced the budget: a large one-time donation, a staffing shortage, the PPP loan, or the ERTC credit.

The bad news: We ended FY 2023 with a deficit.

<u>The good news</u>: The deficit was only half of what we predicted, thanks to your generosity in our fundraisers and appeals, and thanks to the 9% of our members whose increased offertory giving nearly balanced the reduced giving other members needed to make. We have a sufficient cash reserve to cover this shortfall.

Our expenses continue to rise due to inflation, healthcare, and utilities, and we are predicting another deficit in FY 2024. Our reserve can only cover a few years of deficits before we would need to make operational changes. Like most churches, nearly all of our controllable costs are related to personnel. Reducing personnel would reduce the number of ministries that we can support.

There are many reasons to remain optimistic. Most giving trends seem to be moving in the right direction. This is a spiritually vibrant community committed to inclusion and justice. We'll provide an impact statement next weekend to accompany the financial report. We know that you are committed to the mission of the Paulist Center. But please prayerfully consider if you could further help us:

- 1. Can you increase your recurring giving? Not everyone can. But if you're not among the 9% of households who increased their giving in FY 2023, please pray if you can in FY 2024.
- 2. Invite friends and neighbors to join us for ministries such as the Wednesday Supper Club or Young Adult activities, for Mass, or for special events such as next weekend's Hecker Award, the Advent-Christmas Concerts, or the Auction in April.
- 3. Volunteer for ministries that help us build up and expand our community. Check out the "Casting a Wide Net" and Marriage Preparation announcements on other pages of this bulletin.
