A Litany to the Holy Spirit

Reader(s): Guide us as we journey together during this time of discernment and uncertainty.

Help us to exist in this moment without judgement of ourselves or of the unknown future.

(Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Help us to remain steadfast in faith - to remember your great goodness, your great love,

your great strength - the peace we find in your presence. Help us to remember that nothing

can separate us from You. (Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Enfold us in your compassion and love, especially at this moment

when we are overwhelmed by our emotions. Bless us with the gift of fortitude, that we may be lifted up

in this time of struggle. (Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Endow in us the gift of understanding, that we may always live as true followers of Christ.

(Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Grant us the gift of right judgment, that we may use and distribute resources

towards peaceful and loving ends. (Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Enliven us with the gift of wonder and awe, that we may always know your perfect love.

(Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Instill in us the gift of wisdom, that we may recognize the dignity in one another and trust in your

ways of mercy and love. Inspire us with the gift of knowledge, that we may always walk in your way.

(Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love.

Reader(s): Open our hearts and minds to seek you with humility and love –

not giving into despair but placing all our hope in You and You alone. (Pause) Come, Holy Spirit.

All: Kindle in us the fire of your love. (*Pause*)

All: Gentle God, you sent us your Spirit to dwell with us always.

May your Advocate accompany us and console us, now and forever. Amen.

^{*} The invocations can be offered by dividing a group into two and prayed antiphonally, starting with group one and then group two and so on.

"FORWARD IN FAITH: 2024 CATHOLIC APPEAL"

The Archdiocese of Boston takes up the Catholic Appeal the weekends of March 2-3 and 9-10. In the words of Cardinal Sean O'Malley, "The Appeal is the primary means by which we carry Christ's light into darkness and care for our brothers and sisters spiritually, emotionally, and physically."

We at the Paulist Center especially commend that the **Appeal helps to fund Mission Grammar School (MGS) in Roxbury and the iTHIRST program for addiction recovery.** MGS serves children as young as three months old, offering a support system for families in an underserved community. iTHIRST has grown into a worldwide ministry, providing training and ongoing support for laity and clergy to become Certified Spiritual Companions to accompany addicted individuals and their families along the road to recovery.
