# DISCERNING BECOMING A CATHOLIC, OR COMPLETING YOUR CATHOLIC SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION BEYOND BAPTISM?

f this is you, or someone you know, Fr. Rick will be holding Inquiry Sessions on Thurs evenings from 7 - 9pm on Sept 12, 19, and 26.

These sessions are for:

- people simply interested in learning more about the Catholic faith but with no commitment to become Catholics, or
- adults who were baptized Catholic or Christian but not catechized who are considering receiving their sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation in the Catholic Church.

  A JOURNEY IN FAITH

In discernment with Fr. Rick, those who are able and ready may proceed on to the catechumenate/candidate process later in the fall, leading to baptism and/or full reception into the Catholic faith at the Easter Vigil on Apr 19.

#### Did you know?

Fossil fuels – coal, oil and gas – are by far the largest contributor to global climate change, accounting for over 75% of global greenhouse gas emissions and nearly 90 per cent of all carbon dioxide emissions. As greenhouse gas emissions blanket the Earth, they trap the sun's heat. The world is now warming faster than at any point in recorded history.

#### Did you also know?

Pope Francis announced the construction of a solar plant on the outskirts of Rome. According to the Holy Father, the new solar plant will significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions and promote climate neutrality. The energy generated by this solar plant will cover all the Vatican's energy needs, eliminating dependence on fossil fuels.
