The first meeting will be **Sun**, **Oct 13** in the 2nd Fl Seminar Rm and we'll be reading **Black Liturgies** by **Cole Arthur Riley** For this first meeting, we will focus on the first chapter. It is fine if you can't make every meeting.

Synopsis of the book:.

Amid national racial violence, the isolation of the pandemic, and a surge of anti-Black rhetoric in many Christian spaces, the author began dreaming of a more human, more liberating expression of faith. She went on to create Black Liturgies, a digital project that connects spiritual practice with Black emotion, Black memory, and the Black body. She brings together new prayers, letters, poems, meditation questions, scriptures, and the writings of Black literary ancestors.

As you may or may not be aware, the Paulist Father's nationally have launched an initiative to address toxic polarization in our church and nation.




