



Synopsis of the book:

Amid national racial violence, the isolation of the pandemic, and a surge of anti-Black rhetoric in many Christian spaces, the author started dreaming of a more human, more liberating expression of faith. She went on to create Black Liturgies, a digital project that connects spiritual practice with Black emotion, Black memory, and the Black body. She brings together new prayers, letters, poems, meditation questions, breath practices, scriptures, and the writings of Black literary ancestors.

Paulist Center Invests in Community Solar Energy

investments to offset the carbon emissions of their own electricity use.

he Creation Care Team is pleased to announce that the Paulist Center has taken a significant step in meeting the climate crisis by becoming an anchor investor in the establishment of two new solar energy farms in Massachusetts.



Each month the Center will purchase credits from these farms equal to the amount of electricity it consumes. Those credits will then reduce by 10% the amount the Center would otherwise pay to its electric utility.

The Center's purchases will enable up to 50% of the farms' remaining output to be purchased by low-income customers who will receive a similar 10% discount on their electricity bills.

Early next year, the Creation Care Team will hold an event to provide more information about the Center's investment in these farms and describe how community members can make similar
