FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2025 AT THE PAULIST CENTER

Our First Holy Communion preparation classes will begin this Sun, Jan 26 from 11:15am - 12:30pm. This is a meeting for both parents and children looking to celebrate the Sacrament of First Holy Communion at the 10am Mass on Sun, May 18 at the Paulist Center.

The Rite of Enrollment for First Communion will take place next Sun, Feb 2 at the 10am Mass.



Primarily a home preparation program using **Pflaum Publication's** *Together In Jesus* curriculum, families join in larger group activities over the course of the 5-month preparation period.

Additionally, participants share a Seder meal (date TBD), learn experientially, and reflect on the significance of the Eucharist at a retreat and rehearsal.
