

## STATEMENT FROM PAULIST CENTER STAFF

The Paulist Center's staff joins Catholic Advocacy groups, southern border dioceses, and the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in expressing deep concern after the current administration signed a series of executive orders last week.

We concur with Archbishop Timothy Briglio, President of the US Bishops' Conference, stating "Some provisions contained in the Executive Orders, such as those focused on the treatment of immigrants and refugees, foreign aid, expansion of the death penalty, and the environment, are deeply troubling, many of which will harm the most vulnerable among us."

We will continue the good work of our Immigration Advocacy Group in supporting our brothers and sisters in Christ who are also immigrants, migrants, and/or refugees.

We are also deeply concerned about President Trump signing an executive action stating that the U.S. government will now recognize only two sexes, male and female. This executive order represents a new era of barriers to access essential resources and services for LGBTQ+ people in general, and for transgender people in particular.

We continue to believe that God loves LGBTQ+ persons like anyone else and will continue to support and stand by our beloved LGBTQ+ community members and the broader LGBTQ+ community.

#### The Venerable Father Augustus Tolton. (1854 – 1897)

"Good Father Gus" was the first, visibly African American priest. Born into slavery in Missouri under a Catholic slaveholder, he was raised in a Catholic tradition, although not provided with any of the sacraments. Tolton and his mother escaped slavery by crossing the Mississippi River into Illinois in 1963 and settled in Quincy. Illinois. Fr. Peter McGirr quickly recognized Young Augustus' extraordinary intelligence and yearning for God. He baptized Tolton and prepared him for his First Holy Communion. He became very well-educated and multilingual. Despite strong support, not one American seminary would accept Augustus as a novitiate. The bishop was not deterred and arranged

for him to be schooled at the Pontifical Urban University in Rome. He was ordained in 1886, and sent back to Quincy, Illinois to be a missionary to his fellow African Americans where he faced strong opposition from local clergy. Tolton was granted a relocation to Chicago for the construction and evangelization of St. Monica's church, a mission especially for African Americans on Chicago's South Side. He was known for his works of mercy, passionate evangelization, and beautiful voice. His life was tragically cut short when he died of heat exhaustion at a retreat for priests. He was declared Venerable by Pope Francis in June 2019.
