


Come learn about transcendentalism and ponder how it affected the founder of the Paulist Father's Spirituality.

CALLED TO SERVE? THE PASTORAL COUNCIL NEEDS YOU

 Γ he Pastoral Council includes eight community members and offers leadership in the Paulist Center community in several ways.

The role includes approval of the budget, appointment of permanent committees, supervising the operation of the Center in collaboration with the Paulists, and communicating with the Paulist Center community about Council actions and general issues affecting the community.

Council members, ages 18 or older, are expected to attend monthly meetings (currently held in the evening of the last Wednesday of the month), be an active member in the community, be willing to listen to different voices, and represent the perspectives of all community members in order to help the Director fulfill his responsibilities. Council members typically contribute **4-8 hours of time per month** and are **encouraged to be visibly present at Mass and community events.**



To apply, you must obtain **25 signature endorsements** from Paulist Center Community Members and submit a **250-300 word statement** as to why you wish to serve in this capacity. Endorsements and statements are **due by Friday, May 30**.

Elections for council members will be held from June 8-16 for five new members who have a two-year term from Sept 1, 2025, to August 31, 2027.
