RESPONDING TO ASSAULTS ON THE DIGNITY OF LIFE

So many in our community are gripped by anxiety; our hearts are broken. We cannot ignore the harsh realities pressing upon us. In the face of turmoil, we must seek wisdom—not as passive observers, but as people determined to act. Many of us, despite our heartbreak, are already leading, advocating, serving, and resisting in very personal ways in a wide variety of positions and settings.



To comprehend this present moment, we need only look to the rich history of our Catholic Social Teaching – our anchor in truth and our counterbalance to the forces that seek to deceive and destroy. Our shock and dismay are not misplaced—the atrocities we are witnessing daily stand in direct opposition to God’s will for humanity. And yet these very teachings do more than affirm our outrage; they call us to rise, to seek justice, and to act with conviction.

As our context has become increasingly challenging this spring, conversations with ministry leaders and staff have suggested that we find ways to come together to build community and highlight the commonalities across our efforts. This has led us to lift up Catholic teaching, which drives our social justice work, and to specifically underscore the Dignity of Human Life as a theme that is woven across our ministries. We seek to do this to support one another in the coming year, even as we discern a pastoral plan that can guide us over the years ahead.

Therefore, this upcoming year, let us keep one of the key themes of our Catholic social teaching – the life and dignity of the human person – front and center in all of the Paulist Center’s programming as we wrestle with the grief we experience at injustice, are nourished, empowered and transformed through our worship and plan the best ways forward to act for justice.

Our hope is that this theme meets the range of the community where we are and will create opportunities for prayer, learning, and responding as this assault on the dignity of human life worsens. We come together as community to acknowledge, collaborate, and support one another in faith. This sobering moment in history calls to our faith community to rise with clarity and courage, steadfast in our call to justice.

SUN*DAY PILGRIMAGE & PRAYER SERVICE: SUN, SEPT 21

Join us as the Paulist Center community joins an interfaith celebration of the power of Sun and Wind! **SUN*Day is a national day of action on Sept 21, celebrating the unstoppable rise of clean energy.** Many Boston-area faith communities are coming together to showcase the power of sun and wind — energy sources that can power our world without pollution.



Three ways to participate:

- Join us at **1pm at Old South Church**, 645 Boylston St, Boston for an interfaith procession to Boston Common with music, banners, and brief prayer proclamations along the way. The procession (.9 mile) will be down Newbury St. which is closed to traffic that day.
- Join us at **2pm on Boston Common**, near the State House steps, for a 30-minute multi-faith celebration of hope.
- Join us at **12pm at St. Clement's Basilica**, 1105 Boylston St., for a light lunch, brief sending forth prayer, and a "Pilgrimage of Hope" to Old South Church. **Join Paulist Center friends making our way to the Basilica after the 10am Mass.**

St. Clement to the Common is 1.8 miles. Alternate: take Green Line along the route, or join a procession from King's Chapel (.3 mile), at 1:30pm.

LITURGICAL DANCE WORKSHOP - SUN, SEPT 7


