

DIRECTOR'S REFLECTION

Dear Companions on the Journey,

Back in June, as a follow-up to the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis established a "day": a "Day of the Poor." It will now be observed every year on the 33rd Sunday of the year (today). Among what he wrote, Pope Francis said:

"Yet there have been times when Christians have not fully heeded this appeal [to prioritize the poor in their moral vision and life], and have assumed a worldly way of thinking. Yet the Holy Spirit has not failed to call them to keep their gaze fixed on what is essential. He has raised up men and women who, in a variety of ways, have devoted their lives to the service of the poor. Over these two thousand years, how many pages of history have been written by Christians who, in utter simplicity and humility, and with generous and creative charity, have served their poorest brothers and sisters!

"Let us, then, take as our example Saint Francis and his witness of authentic poverty. Precisely because he kept his gaze fixed on Christ, Francis was able to see and serve him in the poor. If we want to help change history and promote real development, we need to hear the cry of the poor and commit ourselves to ending their marginalization."

Another of those witnesses was St Vincent de Paul (1581-1660). It makes me uneasy to read: "It is not enough to give soup and bread. This the rich can do. You are the servant of the poor, always smiling and good-humored. They are your masters, terribly sensitive and exacting master you will see and the uglier and the dirtier they will be, the more unjust and insulting, the more love you must give them. It is only for your love alone that the poor will forgive you the bread you give to them."

One of my new, favorite poets, born to Somali parents in Kenya, British poet Warsan Shire, wrote: "later that night / i held an atlas in my lap / ran my fingers across the whole world / and whispered / where does it hurt? // it answered / everywhere/ everywhere / everywhere."

What do you think?

And let us pray for/with one another.
