
#### RECYCLING AT THE PAULIST CENTER



#### **DIRECTOR'S REFLECTION**

Dear Companions on the Journey,

Fr. Alexander Schmemann was a very influential 20th Century Christian Orthodox priest. He wrote:

"The Church is not a society for escape - corporately or individually - from this world to taste of the mystical bliss of eternity. Communion is not a 'mystical experience': we drink of the chalice of Christ, and He gave Himself for the life of the world. The bread on the paten and the wine in the chalice are to remind us of the incarnation of the Son of God, of the cross and death. And thus it is the very joy of the Kingdom that makes us remember the world and pray for it. It is the very communion with the Holy Spirit that enables us to love the world with the love of Christ. The Eucharist is the sacrament of unity and the moment of truth: here we see the world in Christ, as it really is, and not from our particular and therefore limited and partial points of view. Intercession begins here, in the glory of the messianic banquet, and this is the only true beginning of the Church's mission. It is when, 'having put aside all earthly care,' we seem to have left this world, that we, in fact, recover it in all its reality."

## **Immigration Advocacy Group**

Overnor Baker signed into law the \$15 Minimum Wage Law and the Paid Family Medical Leave law that we worked so hard with our colleagues in Raise UP MA to get passed. Thank you for stopping and signing the petitions that our volunteers coordinated three Sundays in a row in June. This important bill means that we have enabled millions of people in MA to have more opportunity and security in their lives! Specifically, this will help 840,000 low wage earners get \$2.75 billion (yes billion!) in wage increases over 5 years. The Paid Family Medical Leave law will enable almost all workers in Massachusetts - many millions - to get 20 weeks of paid time off for serious illness or injury to themselves and up to 12 weeks to care for a family member with such illness or injury who needs their care. It also covers maternity, paternity, and military leave. Watch for more information about the Immigration Advocacy Group in upcoming weeks.

## St. Dismas Committee (Criminal Justice Reform)

Last month, Governor Charlie Baker signed two major pieces of criminal justice legislation that passed with overwhelming bipartisan support in the legislature. Together, these bills represent the most significant changes to the state's criminal justice system in decades. The St. Dismas Committee members are excited that their efforts in meeting with Senator Brownsberger, organizing petition signings, and encouraging the community to write/call their legislators contributed to these significant bills passing in Massachusetts. In brief, what does this legislation mean for Massachusetts residents?

- 1.) Expanded earned-time credits will be afforded to people who complete recidivism-reduction programs and treatment.
- 2.) Judges will have more pretrial alternatives to incarceration.
- 3.) Judges will take a defendant's ability to pay bail into account when setting bail.
- 4.) People who have behavioral health needs may be diverted from jail.
- 5.) Mandatory minimums will be eliminated for some drug crimes and imposed for others.
- 6.) Data collection and transparency will be improved.
