Be a sponsor/mentor on the journey of faith – it is the responsibility of the whole local community of faith to assist those women and men whose journey of


faith is leading them towards celebrating a sacrament or membership in the Catholic Church. Some of our needs this coming year will be:

# **Confirmation Leader - Volunteer Description**

- + Provide leadership to approximately 10-20 high school students (grades 9-12) twice a month from 11:15am - 1:15pm through classroom discussions, social justice activities, off-site meetings and socials.
- Share in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of meetings, social activities and social iustice opportunities to ensure fun and worthwhile ministry to the youth of The Paulist Center Community.
- Be a consistent adult presence at meetings enthusiastically welcoming all youth, having fun, and showing interest in the individual lives of the youth.
- + Be a role model of a person who proclaims and lives a faithful life in the Catholic tradition, including worship and service to and with others.
- + Share in the facilitation/leadership of meetings and/ or plan and assist youth to facilitate meetings; keep written outline of meeting and resources used.
- Communicate with other adult youth ministers, Coordinator and Pastoral Minister, and overall community about youth group.
- + Recruit other potential adult youth ministers.

## **DIRECTOR'S REFLECTION**

Dear Companions on the Journey,

For years, this prayer was attributed to one of the Paulist Center's patron saints Archbishop Oscar Romero. They are actually the words of former Detroit Archbishop John Dearden, preaching at a priest's funeral. Wherever they come from, these words speak to me:

"It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is a way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us. No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection. No pastoral visit brings wholeness. No program accomplishes the church's mission. No set of goals and objectives includes everything. This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities. We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers. not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own. Amen."
