CANONIZATION OF ARCHBISHOP OSCAR ROMERO

Archbishop Romero was brutally murdered as he celebrated Mass at a small hospital chapel in San Salvador on March 24, 1980. The assassination intensified a civil war in El Salvador and marked the beginning of Salvadorans' veneration of Romero as a martyr and a saint. Last month, Pope Francis gave his blessing to his canonization. Please join us for food, speakers, and music as we celebrate this special event.

Dear Companions on the Journey,

About three years ago, Pope Francis wrote his letter, 'Laudato Si'," about Christians caring for the environment. This month the Paulist Center's, "Care for our Common Home" committee, has been leading us through various ways to live out this vibrant document...which most of us haven't read! So here Jesuit James Martin gives us the "Top Ten Takeaways from 'Laudato Si'." (Better. go to the website <vatican.va> and read 'Laudato Si'" yourself - but it's long!) ...

- The spiritual perspective is now part of the discussion on the environment.
- The poor are disproportionately affected by climate change.
- Less is more.
- Catholic social teaching now includes teaching on the environment.
- Discussions about ecology can be grounded in the Bible and church tradition.
- 6. Everything is connected—including the economy.
- Scientific research on the environment is to be praised and used.
- Widespread indifference and selfishness worsen environmental problems.
- Global dialogue and solidarity are needed.
- 10. A change of heart is required.

Our "Care for our Common Home" committee has worked very hard to educate and inspire us this September, drawing from various dimensions of Pope Francis' letter. Please take some time to check out the back wall of the Chapel to see their very doable and pithy recommendations to kind of "get the ball rolling" in your home and place of work.
