ADULT CONFIRMATION



The next session of the Rolling Book Club to discuss American Ghosts by Edward Santella, will be held on Sunday, April 7th at 11:20am - between the Masses. American Ghosts, a novel, explores what can happen when a family moves into a new home in a Massachusetts town to find the house haunted. When the children confront the ghosts, they learn of the abuses of slavery that occurred in the house and the neighborhood. To solve their problem, they must deal with the consequences of racism in a world that does not want to acknowledge it exists.
