DIRECTOR'S REFLECTION

Dear Companions on the Journey,

Former Anglican Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams, besides being an insightful and eloquent theologian, is also a very good poet. I like his "Advent Calendar":

Advent Calendar

He will come like last leaf's fall. One night when the November wind has flaved the trees to bone, and earth wakes choking on the mould, the soft shroud's folding.

He will come like frost. One morning when the shrinking earth opens on mist, to find itself arrested in the net of alien, sword-set beauty.

He will come like dark. One evening when the bursting red December sun draws up the sheet and penny-masks its eye to yield the star-snowed fields of sky.

He will come, will come, will come like crying in the night, like blood, like breaking, as the earth writhes to toss him free. He will come like child.

And From Pope Francis:

ADVENT INVITES US TO A COMMITMENT to vigilance, looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves up to the needs of people, of brothers and sisters, and to the desire for a new world. It is the desire of many people tormented by hunger, by injustice, and by war. It is the desire of the poor, the weak, the abandoned. This is a favorable time to open our hearts, to ask ourselves, concrete questions about how and for whom we expend our lives.

What do you think?



THE BICENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY
OF FR. ISAAC HECKER'S BIRTH

Servant of God, Isaac Hecker, founder of the Paulists, was born on December 18, 1819. On Wednesday, December 18, the Paulists will commemorate the Bicentennial of his Birthday.

The following is an excerpt from Father Hecker's diary on the occasion of his 25th birthday.

Let me look back for a few moments and see where I stood last year at this time (an incomprehensible length!) and where I now seem to stand. Then my faith was dim, unfixed and unsettled, then I was not so disentangled from the body and its desires as I hope in God I now am. In all I feel a consciousness that since then I have spiritually grown-been transformed. For my present I cannot speak. For my future it seems I dare not speak. Dreams of the future! Exalted visions of the beautiful! Unspeakable hopes! Deep untranslatable longings that fill the conscious soul.

On Sunday, December 22, we remember the $131^{\rm st}$ anniversary of Fr. Hecker's death (1888).

CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME ~ DURING ADVENT

The Common Home ministry encourages you, as you prepare for Christmas, to hear "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" as Pope Francis suggests in his Letter Laudato Si'. Each week in the bulletin, we offer 3 specific suggestions to consider:

- 1. Pray daily, for example (from *Laudato Si'*): "God of Creation, teach us that we are united with every living thing."
- 2. Prepare your heart for the coming of Christ by taking action, for example: Experiment with adding a brief meditative practice to your day, e.g., watch a sunrise, Centering Prayer, take a slow walk, savor a poem, etc.
- 3. Choose alternatives to traditional gift-giving, for example: Use the Heifer International catalog to choose a specific gift for a needy family, for example 'Gift of Trees' seedlings & saplings for an African family (\$60), given in honor of someone on your Christmas list.
