

If you plan on attending and/or if you have lost a loved one during the pandemic and **would like the person's name read at the prayer service**, please let us know **here**.


Bring your own chairs if you are able. We will have some available.

# FAMILY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM (FREP) 2021-2022

All religious education and sacramental preparation classes at the Paulist Center will, for the most part, be presented **VIRTUALLY** this year (at least until it is safer to gather physically). We are exploring the **possibility of outdoor meetings for the younger grades**.

Classes will begin on Sunday, November 7th, and will take place approximately twice a month.

Class times for our pre-school (ages 3-5) program, classes for grades 1-6, as well as our Jr. High & Sr. High teen programs, will be finalized in the next two weeks.

Sacramental preparation programs (First Reconciliation and First Communion) will also mostly be virtual, but will be adjusted based on COVID numbers and safety regulations.

In terms of curricula for this year, all grades will begin with a 3-session program on racial justice entitled, Deep Blue Life, Anti-Racism: Prejudice and Stereotypes.

Afterwards, our youngest members (ages 3-5), will use a new book and curriculum entitled *Drawing God* written by Karen Kiefer, Director of the *Church in the 21st Century* at Boston College.

**Grades 1-6** as well as the **Junior High teens**, will continue to use the lectionary-based curriculum, **Pflaum Gospel Weeklies.** 

Our Sr. High teens will use a variety of resources starting with Bryan Massingale's powerful essay The Assumptions of White Privilege and What We Can Do About It.

In an attempt to integrate our racial justice efforts into all our ministries at the Center, our FREP kick-off event is scheduled to happen in person on Sunday, October 24th at 1pm at The Royall House & Slave Quarters in Medford. The Royall House Association explores the meanings of freedom and independence before, during, and since the American Revolution, in the context of a household of wealthy Loyalists and enslaved Africans.

Along with an outside prayer and a blessing on the grounds, families are invited to sign up for a tour of the museum, which will be done in 12-person groups, 15 minutes apart to maintain safety guidelines. Masks are mandatory.

If the inside tour makes families nervous in any way, please still join us outside as the grounds themselves inspire much reflection and prayer. ## September 18: Quotes from Laudato Si' - Week Three

"Christian spirituality proposes an alternative understanding of the quality of life, and encourages a prophetic and contemplative lifestyle, one capable of deep enjoyment free of the obsession with consumption. Christian spirituality proposes a growth marked by moderation and the capacity to be happy with little. A return to that spiritual simplicity allows us to stop and appreciate the small things, to be grateful for the opportunities which life affords, to be spiritually detached from what we possess, and not to succumb to sadness for what we lack. "A technological and economic development which does not leave in its wake a better world cannot be considered progress." (194)

## September 25: Quotes from Laudato Si' - Week Four

"The climate problem is aggravated by a model of development based on the intensive use of fossil fuels at the heart of the worldwide energy system (23) The mindset of short-term gain and results dominates present-day economics and politics. (181) Finance overwhelms the real economy." (109)

"Along with the importance of little everyday gestures, social love moves us to devise larger strategies to halt environmental degradation and to encourage a "culture of care" which permeates all of society. When we feel that God is calling us to intervene with others in these social dynamics, we should realize that this too is part of our spirituality, which is an exercise of charity and, as such, matures and sanctifies us."
