# LOOKING BACK OVER THE PAST 8 MONTHS...

(A Financial Update for June 17-18)

The current Paulist Center fiscal year runs from September 1, 2022 to August 31, 2023. Now that we have closed the books on the Auction, we thought it was appropriate to give you an update.

In a nutshell:

**The Bad News:** We're still predicting a deficit for FY 2023.

The Good News: It's not as big a deficit as we had previously predicted!



Since the pandemic began, it has become harder to predict trends in giving, making budgeting more of an art and less of a science. Nevertheless, we projected a deficit of \$173,000 (nearly 10% of our operating budget!) for FY 2023. This is because of several factors, including a 30% increase in utility rates over the past 5 years.

Although offertory collections are down 4% from last year — due in part to some members of our community transitioning to fixed retirement incomes — other numbers are trending in the right direction. Roughly 40 families increased their electronic giving since November 2022. The Advent-Christmas Concert, the Christmas Appeal, the Easter Appeal, and the Auction all exceeded revenue expectations. We received two sizable, unexpected one-time donations. And as taxing as it was to have Fr. Ed working only part-time these past 3 months, we only had to pay half of his salary and benefits. It's still not clear where we'll end this fiscal year, but right now, we're predicting a deficit between \$65,000 and \$120,000, down by 1/3 to 2/3 from initially predicted!

We have sufficient cash reserves to weather another "rainy" year or two after this year, but we continue to face some strong head winds. The long-term solution to our challenge is obvious: we need to expand our membership. After all, that's what Jesus calls us to do in the Great Commission! (See Matthew 28:18-20.) We've focused this past year on more explicitly welcoming new members and first-time visitors, and we hope to launch an outreach campaign of some kind in the next year. Please encourage your friends and neighbors, including those who have drifted away from the Catholic Church, to join us here!

#### Here are some other ways that you can help:

- First and foremost, if you are able to, please consider starting or increasing your recurring electronic gift. That is the best source of predictable, reliable income for the Paulist Center. Thanks to everyone who has done so this past year!
- Consider getting involved with our marriage preparation program. If we had more couples able to give a few presentations each year, we could introduce more young adults to the Paulist Center through marriage prep, and their fees for attending the weekend could yield \$100,000 income per year.
- Plan on supporting our FY 2024 fundraisers to the fullest extent possible.

#### Feel free to pass along other suggestions to us, but please keep in mind the following:

- Donations made to the Supper Club cannot be used to cover general operating expenses.
- Most grant-giving institutions fund new initiatives, not general operating expenses.
- Signage on our building is severely restricted by the Boston Historical Commission.
- We do not have the cash reserve to support large-scale advertising.

Even though our current financial situation is serious, let's keep in mind that by many other measures, it's been a great year for the vitality of the Paulist Center Community!

Our Commonwealth is in the middle of a severe housing crisis. Public housing is in decay, home ownership is harder than ever, and not enough money has been invested to tackle this problem. We believe that with more political will, this can be turned around.

Over 800 people from many faith communities and tenant neighbors in Greater Boston will be there to urge Governor Healey and other state government leaders to commit to GBIO's statewide Housing Justice Campaign.
