Although finances are tight, we pay higher utility rates to promote recycling and the use of green energy. We pay our staff a living wage. Previous Paulist Center initiatives include

establishing one of the world's first ministries to divorced and separated Catholics, supporting the Salvadoran village of Hacienda Vieja, advocating for statewide criminal justice reform, providing Saturday breakfasts to people in need, and founding what is now known as Project Bread's Walk for Hunger. Everything we do is immersed in the knowledge of God's deep love for each one of us, a love Christ compels us to share with others.

ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT & IMPACT STATEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023

(September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023)

Instead of issuing the traditional 1-page annual financial statement this weekend, we have produced our first-ever **Annual Impact Statement** for FY 2023, placing our finances in the larger context of our mission.



While we ended the year with a deficit, it was only half of what we predicted, thanks in part to your generosity in our fundraisers and appeals, thanks to minimum building expenses this year (except for an A/V upgrade), and thanks to the 9% of our members whose increased offertory giving nearly balanced the reduced giving other members needed to make. We have a sufficient cash reserve to cover this shortfall.

Our expenses continue to rise due to inflation, healthcare, and utilities, and we are predicting another deficit in FY 2024. There are **many reasons to remain optimistic**. Most giving trends seem to be moving in the right direction. Please prayerfully consider if you could further help us:

- 1. Can you increase your recurring giving? Not everyone can. But if you're not among the 9% of households who increased their giving in FY 2023, please pray if you can in FY 2024.
- 2. Invite friends and neighbors to join us for ministries such as the Wednesday Supper Club or Young Adult activities, for Mass, or for special events such as the Advent-Christmas Concert or the Auction in April.
- 3. Volunteer in ways that can help build up and expand our community, including helping with marriage preparation, organizing Lenten small groups, or co-chairing the Auction.

Thank you for continuing to invest your time, talent, and treasure in this community demonstrating the unconditional love of Jesus Christ!
