



## **The 2023 Isaac Hecker Award for Social Justice**

### **Information and Nomination Guidelines**

Since 1974, the Paulist Center Community has presented the Isaac Hecker Award for Social Justice to an outstanding North American Catholic. Recipients of the award have included locally and nationally recognized women and men – lay people, sisters, priests, and bishops. Some have been involved in direct service to those in need, others in advocacy work and the transformation of structures and institutions. Many of the recipients have been committed to both these dimensions of social action. Most of them overtly and directly connected their faith and action. All have been committed to building a more just and peaceful world. The past recipients are listed on the reverse side.

Isaac Hecker, founder of the Paulist Fathers, was particularly concerned with the growth and development of American Catholicism. Isaac Hecker and the early Paulists devoted themselves to mission preaching, communication of the Word of God. Hecker's spirituality involved looking to the heart, listening to the Spirit, and living in America. The Award was named to honor Isaac Hecker.

**Typical nominations, from Paulist Center Community Members, are 2-5 pages in length with a cover letter expressing the specific reason for which you nominate the person(s). Nominations include:**

- Biographical information with details pertinent to your nomination.
- Detailed description of nominee's social justice activities or project; include how the nominee calls the Paulist Center to further its social mission.
- Supportive information about other social justice activities in which the nominee has been involved, e.g. articles about or by nominee.
- Names and contact information of two references.

Susan Rutkowski, Pastoral Minister, is available for consultation before the deadline. The Committee has only your written nomination upon which to consider your nominee so please include as much detail as you think we may need to contemplate your selection.
