FRAN LUDWIG

TO RECEIVE THE 2023 ISAAC HECKER AWARD FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE THIS SAT, SEPT 28!



lease join us this Sat, Sept 28 to celebrate Fran Ludwig, Founder and Director of the Boston Catholic Climate Movement, now a chapter of the Global Catholic Climate Movement. Fran will receive the 2023 Hecker Award in our Chapel at our 5pm Mass. We will also live-stream the event. Here is the link.



Even before Pope Francis's Letter on Care for our Common Home was published, Fran Ludwig provided leadership in Catholic responses to environmental and social justice causes. Laudato Si' was a dramatic statement and summons from the leadership of the Catholic Church. Protestant churches took the lead 25 years ago, celebrating the Season of Creation to highlight the charism of St. Francis of Assisi and the pressing need for Christians to heed the call of creation and the poor. Pope Francis' powerful letter in 2015 issued an invitation and challenge to Catholics. Our nominee has been a leader in shaping the answer to this question and in facilitating many Massachusetts Catholics to respond


with both contemplation and action.

Our nominee has a dual emphasis in her work with American Catholics: (1) the spiritual, contemplative response to God's creation and (2) the assertive action required to protect creation and especially the marginalized who suffer most from its degradation. Isaac Hecker was committed to faith in action, particularly in the American Church. Fran Ludwig is living out productive responses to the environmental and social justice needs of our day and leading Catholic organizations in Massachusetts to do the same.


Transcendentalists as Ralph Waldo Emerson, Bronson Alcott and Orestes Brownson, all of whom influenced his spiritual formation.

Did you know?

Landfills are the third largest source of methane emissions in the US. When we consider the impacts of methane over the short term, we see that landfills are emitting the amount of CO2 that would be produced annually by 79 coal-fired power plants. The best way to reduce methane emissions from landfills is simple: keep organic materials OUT of landfills by composting leftover food and reducing food waste.

Did you also know?

To reduce food waste, The Food Drive, a local nonprofit, located in Melrose, MA, connects food that would otherwise be wasted with people who need it. With a two-person staff and 150 volunteers they collect food from commercial and community sources and deliver to local food pantries seven days a week, year round.
