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# 1. Hats Off

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# “Reading the Signs of the Times” at the Paulist Center



- Dedicated:
  - Dedicated long-term community members investing time, talent, and treasure into the community
- Culture-changers:
  - Paulist Center has impacted the Catholic culture of Boston with more welcoming and inclusive Catholic churches downtown
- Declining membership:
  - Over 50% decline in Mass attendance in the last 10 years
- Limited weekday programming/outreach:
  - Increased opportunities for outreach to those who live and work downtown
  - Weekday audience different from the weekend audience



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# “Reading the Signs of the Times” in the US Church today

- Indifference:
  - The greatest barrier for many inactive Catholics is not anger but indifference: the Church feels distant from daily life
- Tradition:
  - Many young Catholics hold progressive social views while still seeking Catholic traditions and devotions in an unstable post-modern world
- Loneliness:
  - 61% of young adults (18-25) say they feel lonely “all the time” (still 36% among adults)

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# “Reading the Signs of the Times” in the US Church today

“

I think a lot of young people, if you talk to them, especially young people who are considering or have re-joined religion in some form, will say that religion gives them a structure, a sense of the transcendent, sort of clarity of form of life that is in many ways absent in normal life. In kind of a modern secular society, especially for young people, you're told that you're free. You can kind of make up your life and your belief system as you go along...in a time when people feel really unboundaried and unmoored, having that clarity, having those rules is actually really compelling

- New outreach to Catholics in Greater-Boston who share in the Paulist Center priorities e.g. social justice, inclusivity, collaboration, etc.
- New outreach to inactive Catholics who feel alienated by the Church
- New outreach to ‘spiritual but not religious’ or spiritually curious


